“The Body Electric” examines the union of electricity and the body in American literature from the Civil War to the Civil Rights era. The project uses the history of electric medicine, from mesmeric trances to electroconvulsive therapy, to reframe canonical texts written by Margaret Fuller, Walt Whitman, Gertrude Stein, George Schuyler, Ralph Ellison, and Sylvia Plath. I argue that the body electric is a powerful cultural trope that shaped intersecting theories of race and reproduction to produce the political identity categories of the modern United States.
